ESTABLISHED IN 1969, THE INTERNATIONAL WINE & SPIRIT COMPETITION (IWSC) was the first competition of its kind, set up to seek out, reward and promote the world’s best wines, spirits and liqueurs. Now in its 46th year, The IWSC’s relentless pursuit of excellence underpins every aspect of the competition.

What sets the IWSC apart is the formidable reputation of its judging process. Panels of carefully selected industry experts — Masters of Wine, buyers, sommeliers, WSET qualified educators and respected wine journalists — meticulously assess each wine on its own merits within the context of its class.

The IWSC receives entries from nearly 90 countries. Winning a coveted IWSC Award is no mean feat.

Only one still wine producer from a country is selected for the highest trophy. (In France, there is also a Champagne Producer of the Year.)
