



Since the first limited production in 1994, the Elvio Cogno winery has drawn upon the knowledge of the old-timers in Piedmont's Langhe region to make a wine for the youth of today. Nascetta was a well known and planted varietal for centuries before being lost in time. Elvio Cogno has been responsible for cultivating the last remaining cuttings and promoting the "re-birth" of this important historical grape long established in the Barolo commune of Novello. Today, Nascetta is recognized as one of the great white wines of the Langhe.
