Domaine de Beurenard has been a family-run estate for eight generations. Currently overseen by brothers Frédéric and Daniel Coulon and Daniel’s sons Victor and Antonin, Domaine de Beurenard produces wines from their own vineyards with holdings in 3 different appellations: Châteauneuf-du-Pape (32ha), Rasteau (25ha) and Côtes-du-Rhône (6ha). Following a long tradition of respect for the land, the family works with all 13 varietals in Châteauneuf-du-Pape and has been certified organic and biodynamic for nearly 10 years across all vineyards.

With 25 plots spread across every type of soil in Châteauneuf-du-Pape and co-fermenting all 13 varietals, the family is able to reach great complexity and finesse with their wines. With the arrival of both Victor and Antonin a few years ago in the cellar and vineyards, the eighth generation is already promising a great future to the Domaine.

Paul (Daniel and Frédéric’s father)

The “memory” of the family, 1964 created the Domaine as we know it today, created the famous Musée du Vigneron in Rasteau.

Daniel (Paul’s son)

Since 1980, vineyard manager and co-winemaker

Frédéric (Paul’s son)

Since 1988, executive manager, export manager (no US), photographer and wildlife specialist

Victor (Daniel’s son)

Since 2016, co-winemaker + US Export, head of the Young Winemaker Association of Châteauneuf-du-Pape

Antonin (Daniel’s son)

Since 2018, vineyard + French market

HISTORY

In the 14th century, during their stays in Avignon, the popes – and especially Pope John XXII – built a papal castle in Châteauneuf-du-Pape.

Impressed by the area’s exceptional soils, they established vineyards on the slopes surrounding the château and were instrumental in promoting the local wine’s reputation around the world.

Domaine de Beurenard has been a family-run estate for seven generations. A notarial act dated 16 December 1695 mentions “Bois Renard”, which over time has become “Beurenard”.



ABOUT THE WINE

70% Grenache 30% Syrah

6 ha of estate owned and biodynamically certified vineyard

Hand-picked and hand-sorted in the vineyard.

Destemmed

Co-fermented for 3 weeks with soft extraction.

Short maturing period of 4 months, 2/3 in stainless steel tank and 1/3 in large foudre to preserve delicacy of the fruit.
